One month from today, Thursday, November 19th, we will have a wonderful opportunity to hear Ambassador Warren Clark speak on "What Churches Can Do for Middle East Peace." The event will be held at St. Asaph's Church, Bala Cynwyd [Conshohocken State Road and St. Asaph's Lane] at 7:30 pm on November 19, 2009.
